I have a pleasure to invite you for a high-level energy conference on "Competitive and integrated energy market as a guarantee of the UE energy security" co-organised by the Polish Ministry of Economy, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Treasury and Energy Regulatory Office in cooperation with the European Commission. The conference will be held on 10-11 October 2011 at the conference centre Auditorium Maximum of Jagiellonian University in Cracow.

The conference will raise key issues regarding EU energy policy such as an increase of competition and security on the common energy market through development of regional cooperation and infrastructure projects. Additionally, on the second day of the conference a consultation on North–South Energy Axis co-organized by the European Commission will take place.

On the 11th October, the 76th CEER General Assembly and the 12th ACER Board of Regulators will be held from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m. After our meeting, I have a pleasure to invite you for a dinner which will take place at 8 p.m. at the "Szara" restaurant, situated in the Main Square of the Old Town in Cracow. The shuttle bus will be provided.

The conference agenda and the practical information regarding the accreditation system, the venue and logistics of the conference will be delivered in the course of this week. The on-line Polish EU Presidency Accreditation System https://accreditation.pl2011.eu/ and the Accommodation System will be active until 3 October 2011 but please register earlier if possible.
