The Agency Work Programme

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THE 2015 WORK PROGRAMME

- The Agency's 2015 Work Programme (WP) should be adopted by
 30 September (a draft was published on 30 June)
- The WP focuses on four priority areas:
 - 1. The (post-2014) completion of the IEM
 - 2. The infrastructure challenge
 - 3. The monitoring of wholesale energy markets
 - 4. The longer-term regulatory challenges
- The 2015 WP includes, for the first time, a multiannual outlook



THE 2015 WP AND THE BRIDGE

- The four priority areas of the 2015 WP already cover most of the short-term actions for the Agency outlined in the Bridge
- Longer-term actions will be carried into future WPs
- The feasibility of the 2015 WP is subject to the appropriate resources being available
 - The 2015 WP is based on the Agency's draft Budget for 2015 adopted by the Administrative Board in March 2014
 - The 2015 WP may need to be revised if the EU Budget does not assign adequate resources to the Agency



KEY BRIDGE ACTIONS AND THE 2015 WP (1)

- Key actions for the Agency in 2015 outlined in the Bridge:
- Priority remains the full implementation of the Third Package and rapid adoption and implementation of Network Codes and Guidelines (including voluntary early implementation)
- Rapid implementation of the **Electricity and Gas Target Models** which should be reviewed and refined as necessary
- Promote liquid and integrated electricity markets
- Bring RES within the market through the Electricity Target Model and facilitate the deployment of DSR
- Develop a more coordinated and consistent approach to assessing system adequacy and advise on design of interventions, in particular on CRMs
- Identify good practice in **infrastructure regulation** for example, the Agency may review its recommendation on the treatment of investment requests
- Refine **the Gas Target Model criteria** for a well-functioning gas market already planned for Q4 2014

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KEY BRIDGE ACTIONS AND THE 2015 WP (2)

Key actions for the Agency in 2015 outlined in the Bridge cont.:

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- Ensure further awareness and participation of stakeholders to meet future challenges and strengthen consumers' and other stakeholders' involvement by establishing stakeholder panels the Agency's Communication Strategy adopted on 18 September 2014 (soon to be published)
- Effectively monitor developments in the IEM, to identify possible market distortions cooperation with BEUC on the assessment of 'switching' behaviour for the 2015 report
- Involve **third countries** in activities of the Agency in line with the current legal framework

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KEY BRIDGE ACTIONS AND THE 2015 WP (3)

Key actions for the Agency in 2015 outlined in the Bridge cont.:

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- Continuously enhance cooperation between NRAs developing specific mechanisms, which may also include proposals for legislative changes to give the Agency the powers to adopt directly decisions to approve legally binding instruments in case of EU-wide proposals
- Develop detailed advice on the enhancement of the regulatory oversight of the ENTSOs which may include proposals to give the Agency the powers to issue binding decisions, where appropriate and proportionate, on ENTSOs' core tasks
- Possible proposals on the regulatory oversight of mandatory and voluntary EU TSO bodies
