Minutes (V1) (Chatham house rules)

1. Opening

The meeting was opened by the chair who welcomed the Experts.

It was agreed that neither Experts nor Regulators shall participate in the meetings via phone. As an exception ACER staff members might participate via video conference when meetings are in Brussels.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved without any changes.

2. Recent issues

The chair provided an update on recent developments with regard to REMIT since the last Expert Group meeting.

3. Disclosure of inside information

The experts were invited to discuss the current practise of publication of inside information and potential means to improve this. Special attention were drawn to the question whether disclosure of inside information should take place on inside information platforms.

4. Publication of aggregated REMIT information for transparency reasons.

The chair pointed out that REMIT foresees the possibility for ACER to publish certain REMIT information in an aggregated way. The Experts discuss whether this would be helpful and which information should be published.

5. Interaction of REMIT and EU financial market legislation

The Experts discussed the question whether the so called REMIT carve out also applies to products delivered outside the EU. They also exchanged views on the impact of gas and electricity position limits published by ESMA and NCAs.

6. Differences In REMIT implementation by trading venues across EU

The Expert Group discussed the available publications done by different trading venues on REMIT.

7. Cross border transmission capacity hoarding – feedback on comments.

Representatives of the Agency's Market Surveillance and Conduct Department presented the feedback and views received by the members of the Expert Group on the topic of cross border transmission capacity hoarding as possible market manipulation under REMIT.

8. Public List of Standard Contracts

A representative of the Agency's Market Integrity and Transparency Department presented how the Agency currently publishes the list of standard contracts. The Expert Group discussed how to improve the current approach.

9. AOB, next meetings

The chair closed the meeting. The next meeting will take place end of February/beginning of March 2018 in Brussels.

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
