

Announcement of Roundtable meetings on REMIT implementation

Ljubljana, 28 November 2018

Subject: Invitation to participate in the Agency's REMIT implementation roundtables

In connection with the implementation of Regulation (EU) No 1227/2011 (REMIT) and Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No 1348/2014, the Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators will organise roundtable meetings with interested stakeholders on REMIT implementation during 2019.

The purpose of the roundtables is to listen to the views of, and obtain information from, interested stakeholders and invite attendees to comment on selected questions on data collection and other compliance issues under REMIT and its Commission implementing regulation, whenever further consideration would be useful.

Contributing to the roundtable meeting is a requirement for all the attendees in order to sustain their eligibility and receive invitations to the meetings. The roundtable meetings should not be seen as an opportunity to receive guidance from the Agency.

Roundtable meetings will be arranged separately for the following stakeholder group and/or sub-group thereof:

- Associations of energy market participants (AEMPs) on transaction reporting guidance and data quality

The Agency will continue the roundtable meetings with the Organised Market Places, Inside Information Platforms and Registered Reporting Mechanisms registered with the Agency. Entities published in the respective lists on REMIT Portal are automatically eligible for participating in these roundtable meetings and there is no need for their registration for the 2019 roundtables.

Further roundtables for additional stakeholder groups will be considered as and when needed.

The roundtable meetings will be held in Ljubljana. Stakeholders are invited to register online at <u>https://www.acer-remit.eu/forms/aemps-roundtable-2019-call</u> their interest to participate in the roundtables by 3 January 2019. **Applications received after this deadline will not be considered.**

The roundtable meetings can accommodate a limited number of participants. In the interest of admitting as many stakeholders as possible while ensuring variety, only one participant per organisation is normally permitted at the roundtable meetings.
