#### 1. Non-standard contracts

With regard to the reporting of back loading. ACER presented the fields of Table 1 and Table 2 in Annex I to the TRUM. A discussion about the reporting obligations of non-standard contracts with defined price and volume took place.

ACER explained to the meeting participants that a non-standard contract with defined price and volume would be reported under Table 1 of the TRUM. ACER noticed there was a need for further clarification of this matter among the meeting participants, so ACER proposed to include the 'Decision Tree' figure in the TRUM, which clearly depicts the differences between the reporting obligations for standard and for non-standard contracts.

The participants further discussed the timing of back loading reporting and the execution of contracts after 7 April 2016. The meeting participants generally agreed that the concept of reporting back loading in Table 2 is the same as in Table 1, except when it is not the existing records of the company.

ACER shared the spreadsheets for Table 1 and Table 2 with the integrated notes with the participants during the meeting.

The discussion later moved onto the topic of the UTI generator tool.

## 2. Other aspects of the REMIT transaction reporting

ACER informed the meeting participants that the first edition of the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document regarding TRUM would be published by the end of July and would be regularly updated afterwards.

## 3. Planning ahead

The meeting participants proposed to have a roundtable meeting in the January-February period in order to reflect upon Phase 1 of the reporting and exchange experiences in that respect.

ACER informed the participants that a new workshop might take place in autumn 2015 before the 'REMIT go-live'. Further information on that matter will be provided in the future.

It was agreed that the date of the next roundtable would be determined in the future, but that it would not take place before the 'REMIT go-live'.

#### **4. AOB**



A meeting participant raised the topic of LNG. ACER responded that the topic was beyond the scope of the meeting. An expert group with the NRAs is dedicated to this specific topic, which means that all relevant discussions take place there.

A meeting participant proposed to have a roundtable dedicated to other topics, like inside information. ACER agreed to see what further actions could be taken in that respect.
